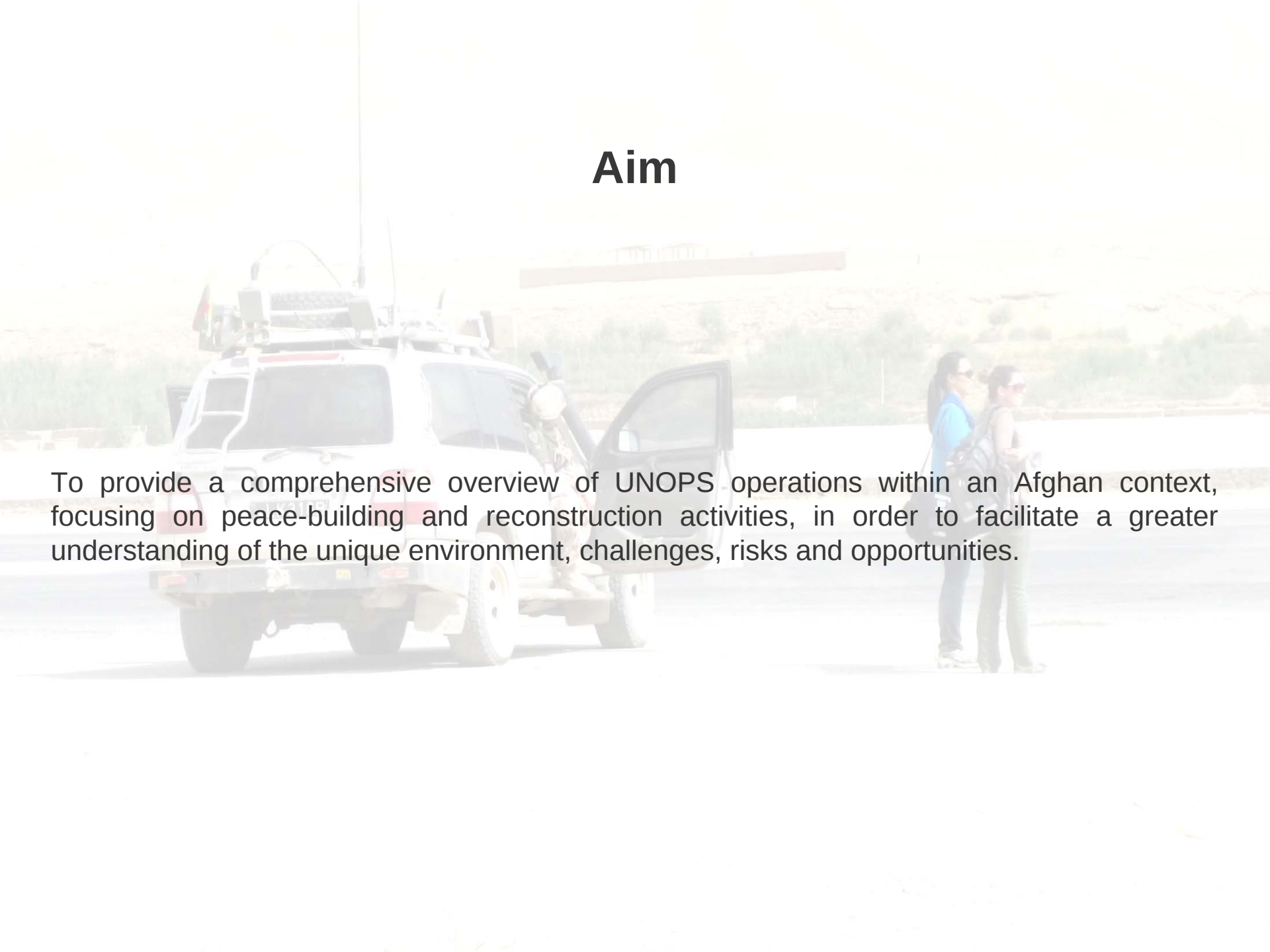

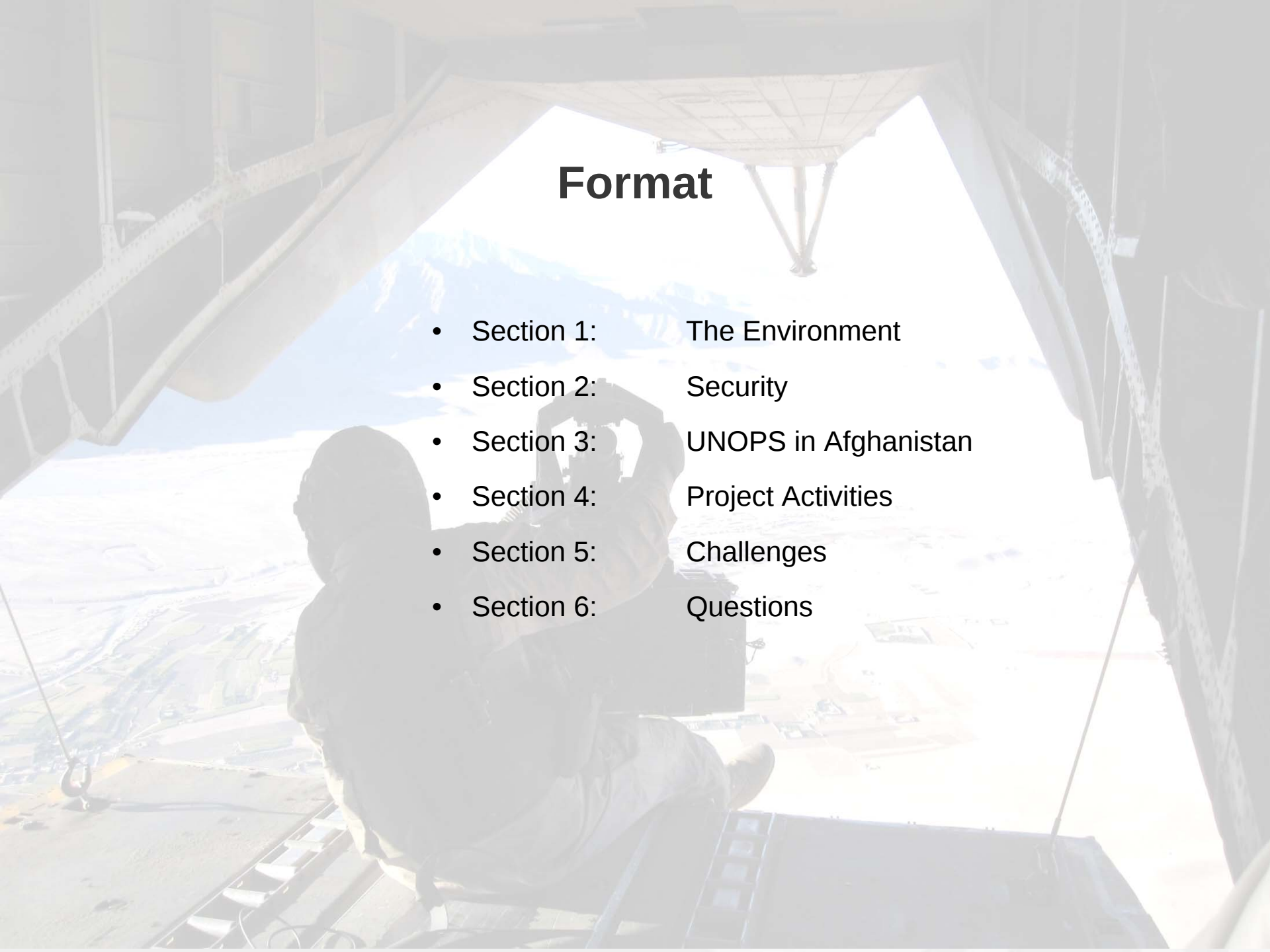

Aim

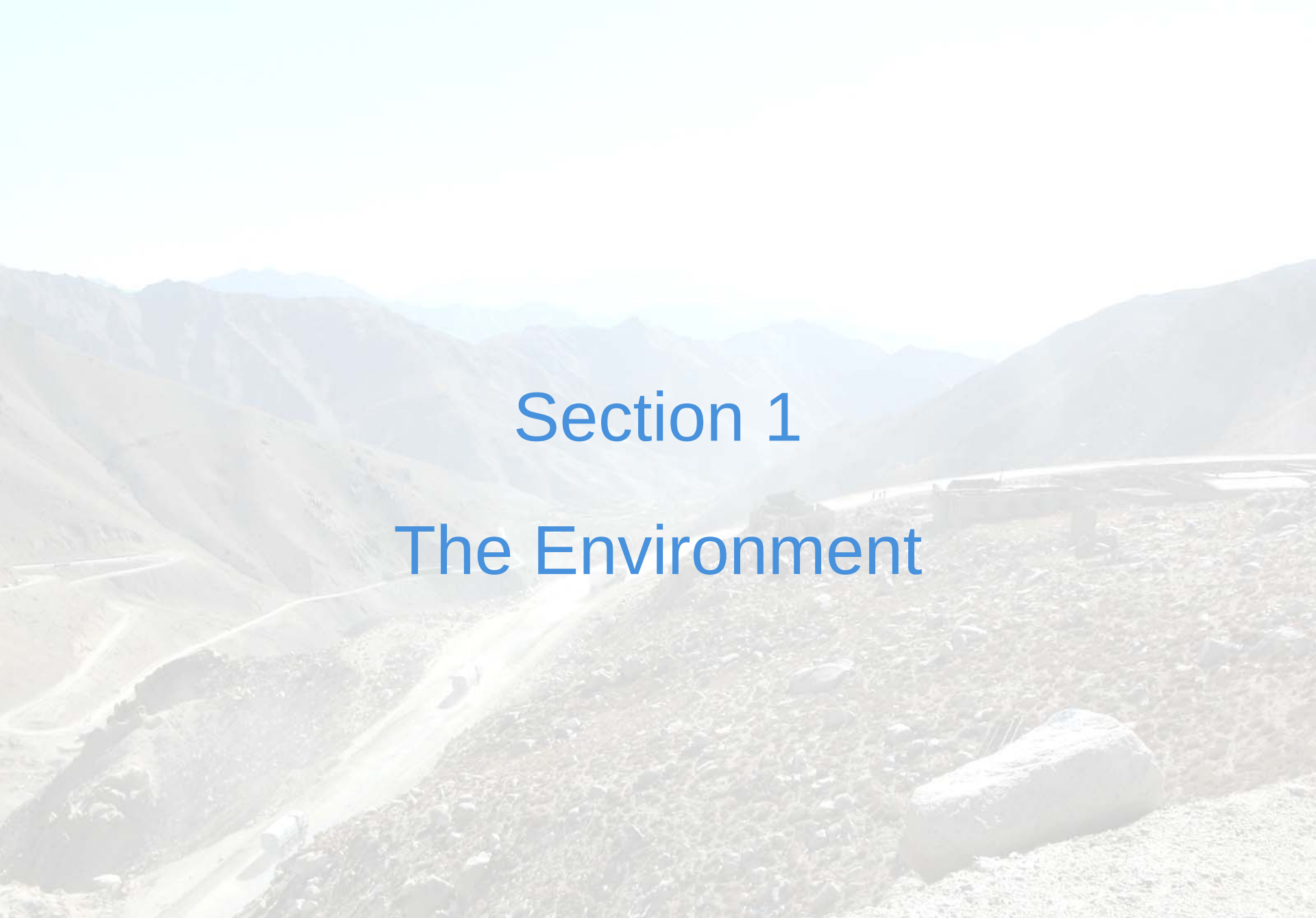

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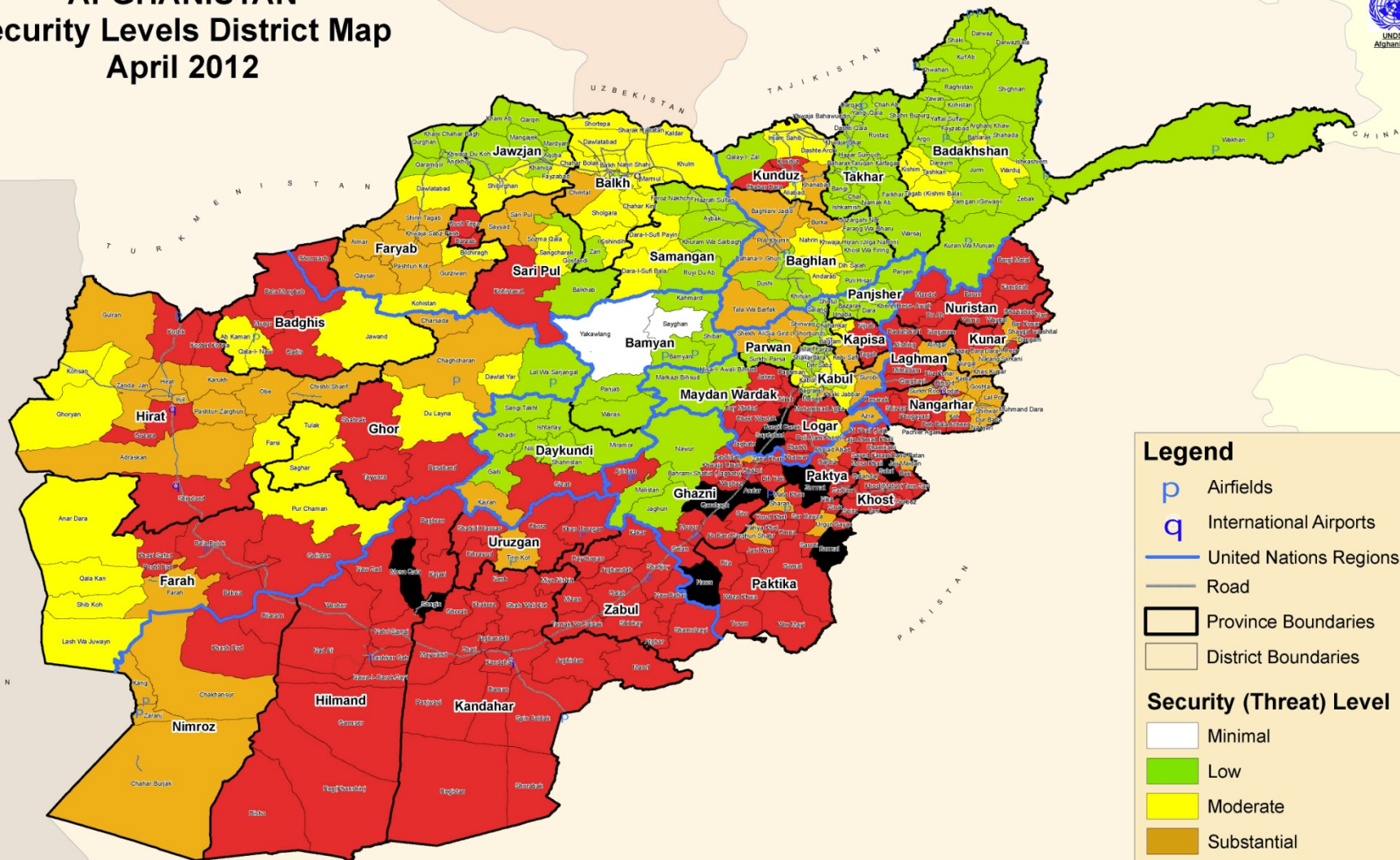


AFGHANISTAN

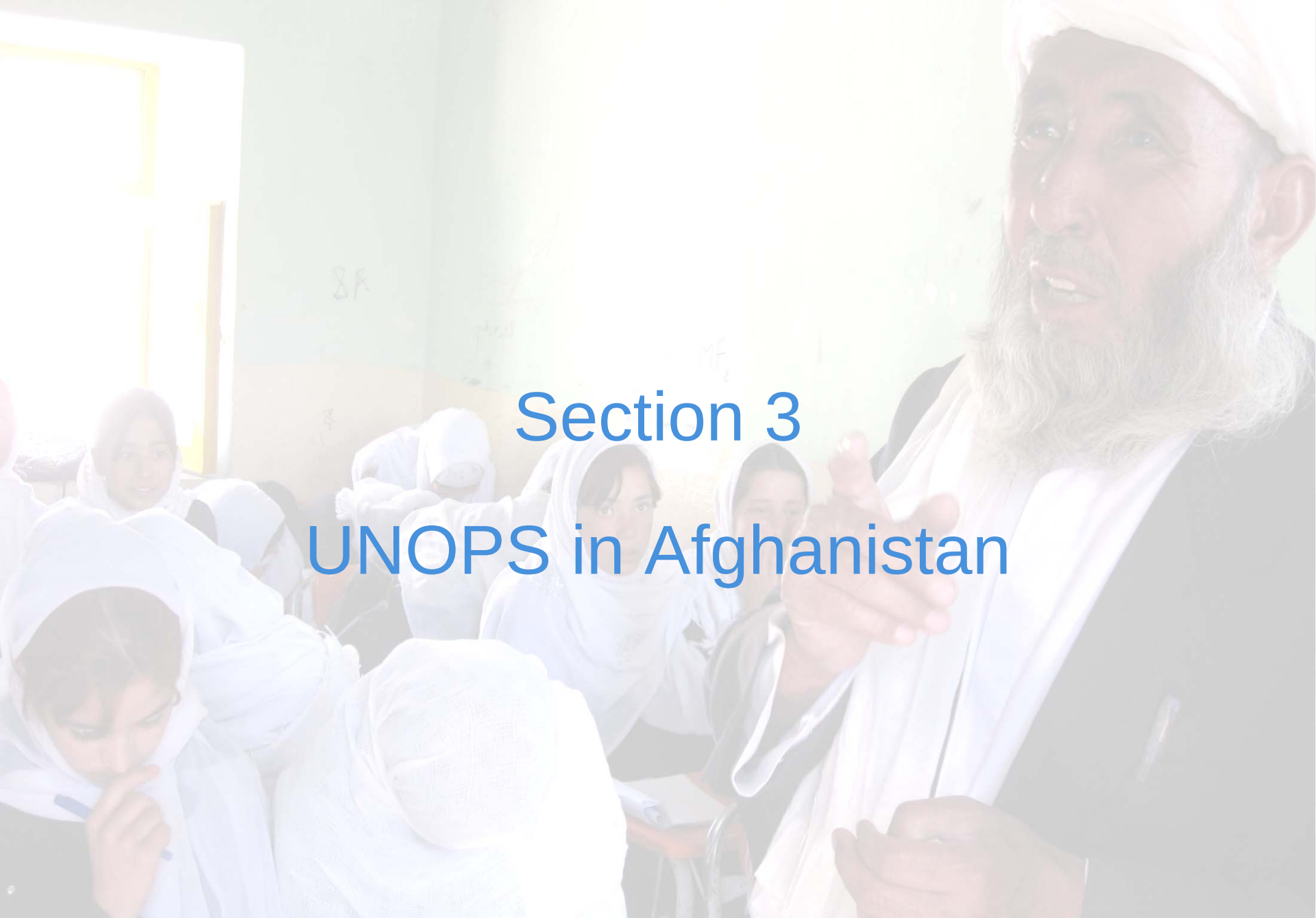

 - \$192 million new business expected this year (2012)



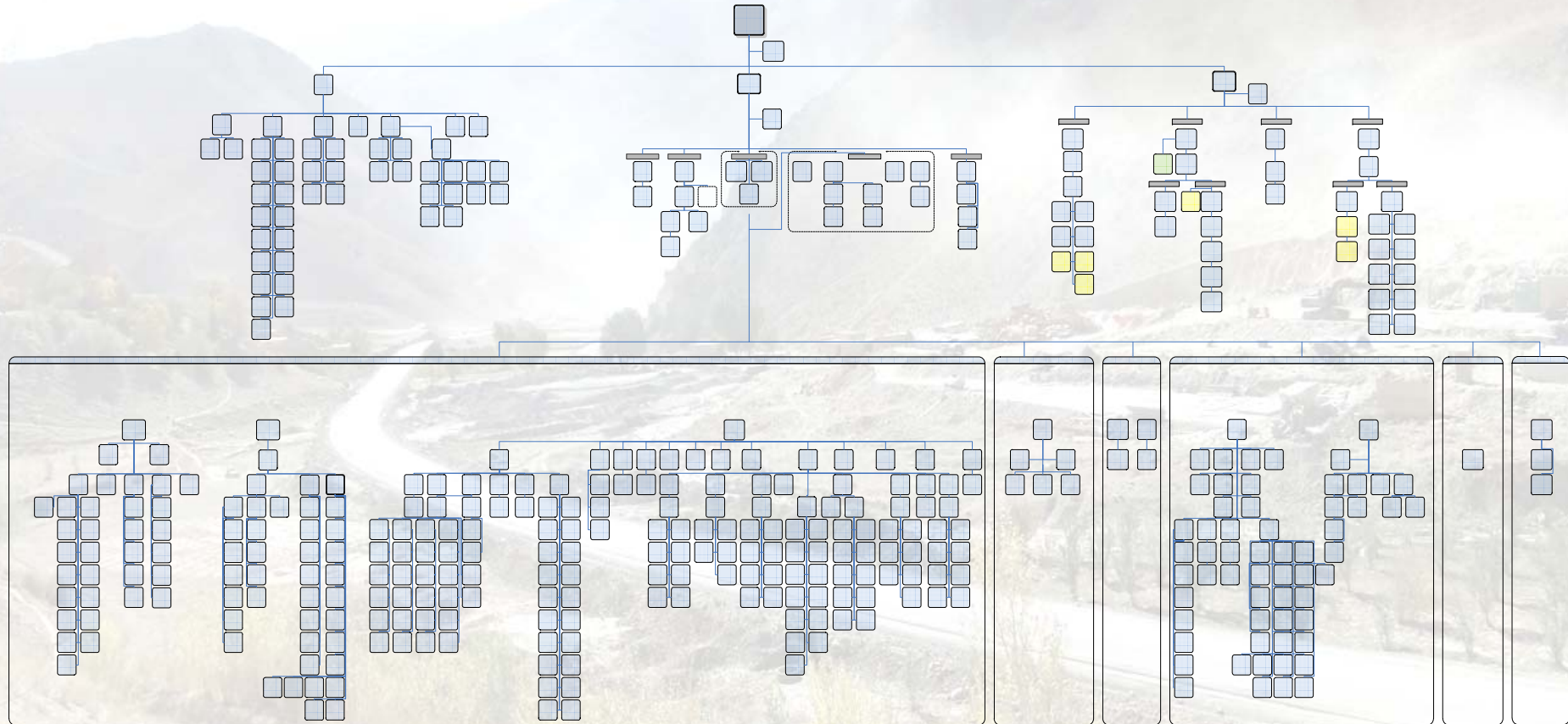

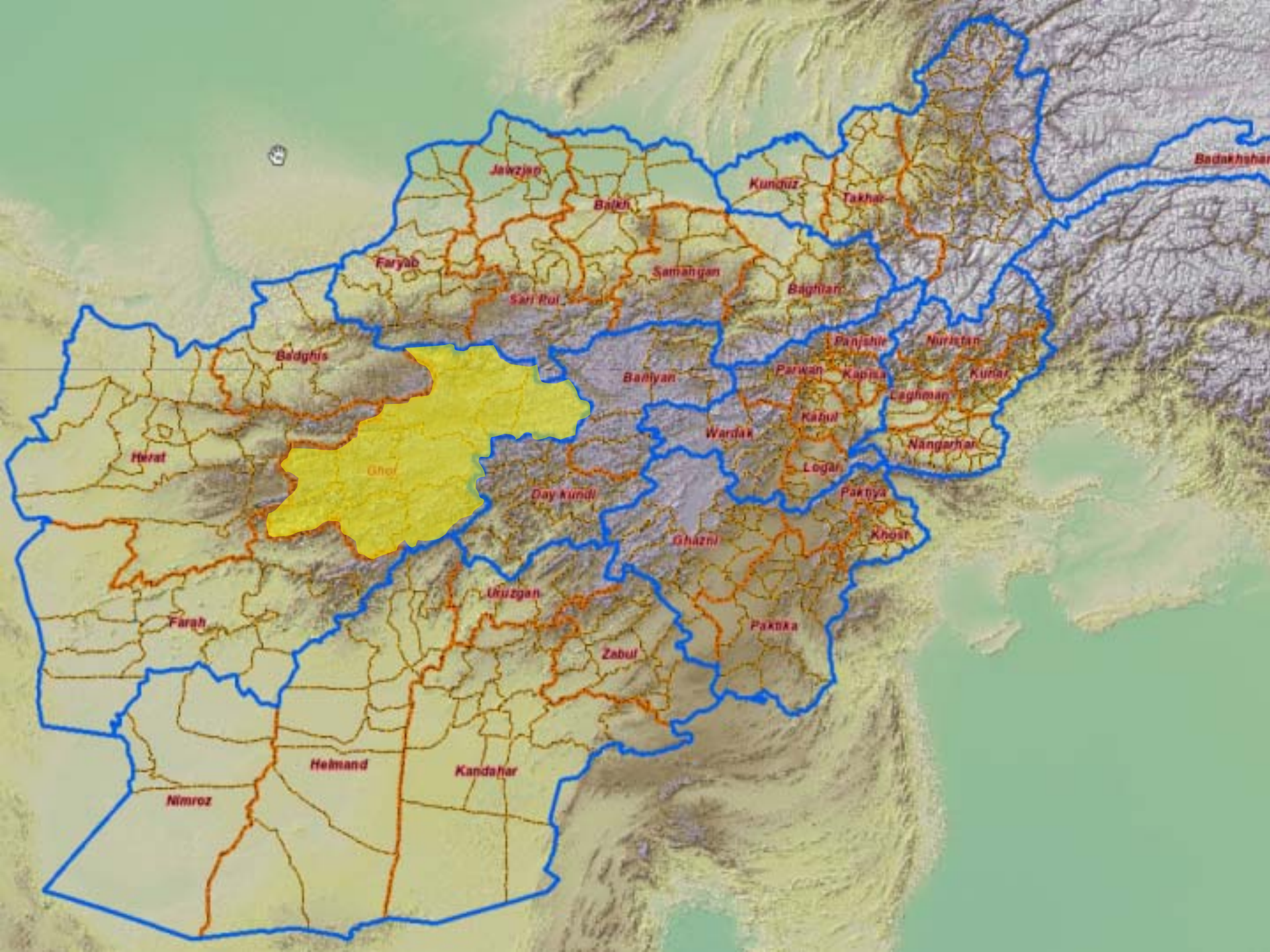

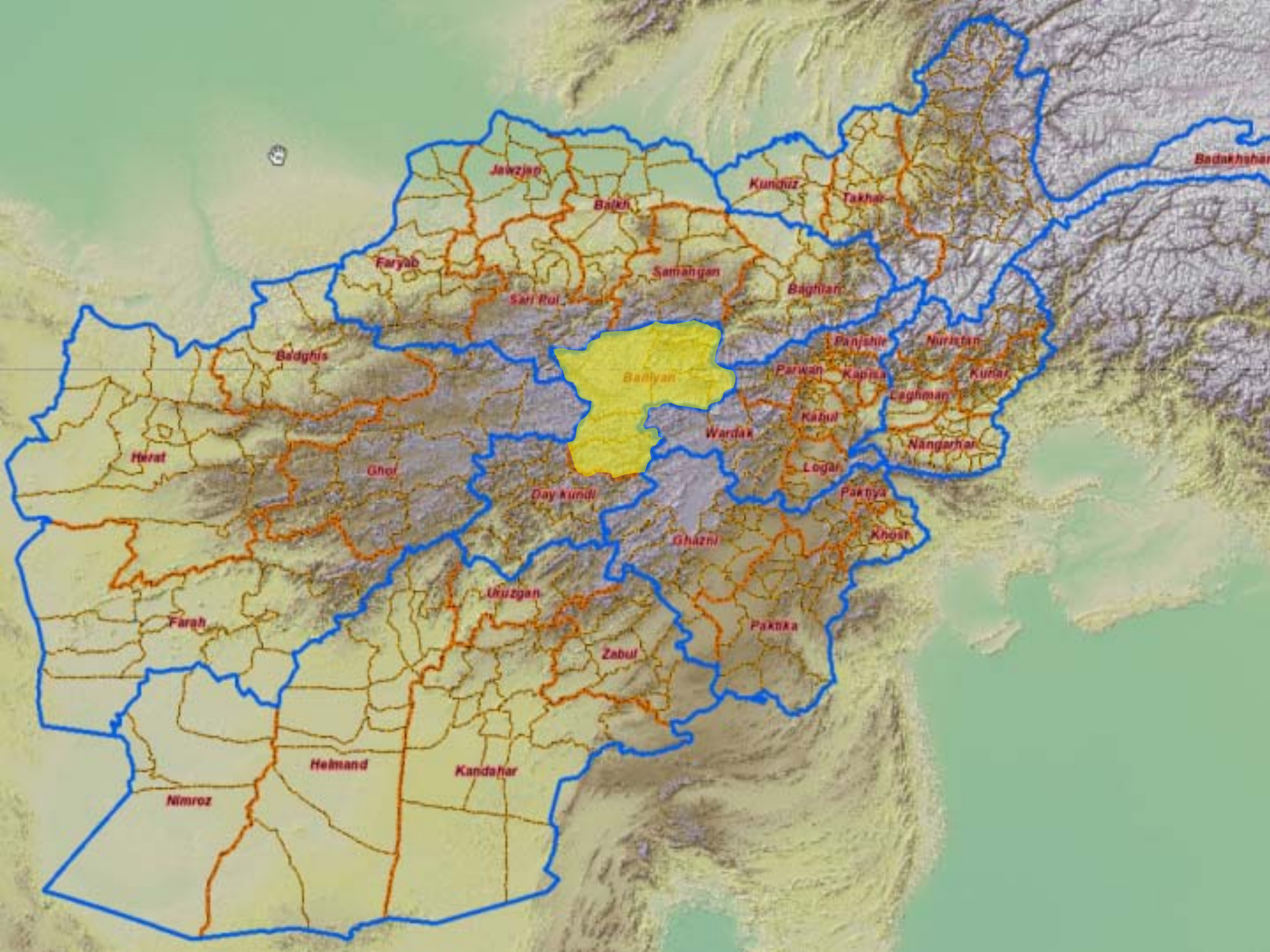
